

GET TO KNOW MILVERTON

25 MINS FROM STRATFORD | 42 MINS FROM KITCHENER | 1 HR FROM GUELPH | 1 HR 50 MINS FROM TORONTO

Originally known as West's Corners, the name of the village was changed to Milverton in 1871- reportedly named after a town in Somerset, England. With the arrival of the Stratford and Huron Railway in 1877, Milverton's agriculturally based industry expanded and the community began to thrive with a population of about 550. Today, the community of approximately 1,800 residents is known for its rich history, friendly locals and beautiful natural surroundings.

PLACES TO VISIT

Milverton Agricultural Fair – Every September, visitors can enjoy various events and activities at the fair including livestock shows, tractor pulls and a midway! The fair is presented by The Milverton Agricultural Society; a volunteer-driven, community-minded, non-profit organization. Their objective is to encourage awareness of agriculture and the environment by providing education, opportunities, and improvements to the quality of life for all citizens.

Millbank Cheese & Butter – Located only 10 minutes from Milverton, stop by Millbank Cheese & Butter, producer of delicious artisan cheeses since 1908. You can taste and buy a wide variety of local cheese and dairy products at their shop, as well as honey, jams, preserves and more!

Milverton Conservation Area – Explore hiking trails, spot wildlife and enjoy all nature has to offer at Milverton Conservation Area!

Ellice Swamp – At 2,115 acres, Ellice Swamp is the largest wetland area in Perth County where you can hike, bird watch, berry pick and more!

G2G rail trail

Since the late 1800's, this land has been a vital transportation corridor, uniting communities and bringing people together. Today, it has evolved into a world-class trail, with over 132km of trail to experience from Goderich to Guelph! The G2G Trail fosters connection: between people, nature, cyclists, hikers, and diverse landscapes.

The Perth Harvest Pathway section runs through Millbank, Milverton and Monkton, stretching about 21km. Enjoy this free trail while preserving and celebrating local history!
